Protestant

A number of any of the Western Christian Churches that separate from the Roman Catholic Church.

Root Word: Protest

Catholic

To do with, or believing in, the Roman Catholic Church, with the Pope as its head.

Anaesthetic

A substance that stops you feeling pain.

Prefix: a/an –not/without

Rebellion

An armed uprising against a government or leader.

Alchemy

A medieval type of chemistry.

Provenance

Origin, where something has come from; documents proving this.

Prefix: Pro-before

Suffix: ance – action

Root Word: ven-coming

Reparations

Compensation paid by a defeated aggressor, e.g. money, land, etc paid by Germany at the end of the World Wars.

Prefix: re-again, back

Suffix: tion- act, process or result

Constitution

A set of basic principles, rights and duties by which a state is ruled.

Prefix: Con – together, with

Suffix: tion- act, process or result

Regicide

The assassination of a King or Queen.

Prefix: Regi- royal, king, queen

Suffix: cide - kill

Dynasty

A line of rulers that inherit power from each other's, usually from a single family.

Prefix: Dyna-power, strength
