

Standard English and Spoken Expression



When presenting your ideas verbally it is important to use **Standard English and to express** your ideas clearly and precisely.

 To ensure that you are using standard English avoid these common regional misunderstandings.

I have took the register

The correct expression is

'I have taken the register.'

I done that

The correct expression is 'I have done that,' or

'I did that.'

I seen that

The correct expression is 'I have seen that,' or

'I saw that.'

Yous

The correct expression is **'You'.** This word is never plural.

I dunno

The correct expression is 'I don't know.'

I have wrote it in my book.

The correct expression is

'I have written it in my book.'

He was sat there

The correct expression is 'He was sitting there.' (When using 'am', 'are', 'was' or 'were', you need to use the verb forms 'sitting' and 'standing')

I didn't get nowt

The correct expression is 'I didn't get anything.'

I could have ran for miles

The correct expression is 'I could have run for miles.'

I didn't go coz...

The correct expression is 'I didn't go because...'

Can I lend a pen?

The correct expression is 'Can I borrow a pen?'
